AS WE GATHER

This week as we follow Jesus on His journey to the Cross, our Gospel reading for today captures the rising tension between Jesus and the Pharisees. As Jesus speaks about being “the cornerstone that the builders rejected,” we are reminded that Jesus is the only firm ground on which we stand. It is in Jesus that we have righteousness “through faith in Christ” (Phil. 3:9). By that gift of faith, we “know him and the power of his resurrection” (Phil. 3:10). Then, in knowing the power of Jesus’ resurrection, we “forget what lies behind” and “strain forward to what lies ahead, pressing on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus” (Phil 13-14).

Back to the Basics: The Creed

Historically, the season of Lent is a time when new Christians were instructed in the basics of the Christian faith as they prepared to be welcomed into the Church by Baptism on Easter Sunday morning. Since these new members were to be received into a living community, the entire congregation was also called to go “back to the basics” with those who were new to the faith. Although the intensity of these traditions have changed over time, it is still a good practice for all Christians to take time to reflect upon the core teachings of our shared faith. During the season of Lent, we will print this “Back to Basics” section every other week, with a brief excerpt from the Luther’s Small Catechism to guide you in this reflection.

The Third Article of the Creed

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

What does this mean?

I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith.

In the same way He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian church on earth, and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith.

In this Christian church He daily and richly forgives all my sins and the sins of all believers.

On the Last Day He will raise me and all the dead, and give eternal life to me and all believers in Christ.

This is most certainly true.

- The Bible is the Word of God.
- The Ten Commandments are a revelation of God's will for our lives.
- Since we cannot keep the Ten Commandments perfectly we cannot save ourselves.
- God provided our salvation for us by sending Jesus Christ, His only Son, to die for our sins.
- Jesus proved His effectiveness by rising from the dead on the third day.
- The only way to heaven is to trust that God has saved us through Jesus' work and his all sufficient death for us.
- God expects His people to gather for worship and service in the local congregation.
