A Message from Pastor Hinrichs

"Don't be alarmed," he said. "You seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has risen; He is not here. See the place where they laid Him. But go, tell his disciples and Peter that He is going before you to Galilee. There you will see Him, just as He told you." And they went out and fled from the tomb, for trembling and astonishment had seized them, and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.

Mark 16:6-8

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

A few years back there was an interesting fad that made its way across TVs throughout our country and even throughout the world: the fad of the "Courtroom Drama". The premise of this genre is to draw the viewers into the emotional and highly charged (and also extremely exaggerated) world of the legal system. And if you've ever watched these shows you know that there is often a "surprise witness" that comes on the stand to testify to some aspect of the crime that they've seen or heard that is critical to the case.

As many of you know, in our midweek worship services we have been hearing from a number of people in Scripture who testified about what they had seen and heard about Jesus' suffering and death. However as we approach Easter, it is important to remember that these witnesses don't just testify to Jesus' death, but also to His resurrection, even if reluctantly at first! In fact, in the portion of Mark's Gospel recorded above, we see a strange phenomenon happening. As soon as the angel makes the announcement about Jesus' resurrection, the women who were at the tomb freeze up. They were so shocked and so scared because it all seemed too good to be true!

As Christian living today, there are times when we, like the women, can also find ourselves dealing with that strange Easter silence. When we stop to consider the news, it can be hard to believe. After all, it isn't everyday that someone comes back to life! But nevertheless, we know the truth: Jesus is risen! Jesus has gone before us! Jesus will reveal Himself to us! It will all be just as Jesus has told us!

As we relive these events of Jesus' death and resurrection this month, I challenge you to go and do what the women first struggled to do: Go and share Jesus with someone! Tell them about a Savior who the grave couldn't contain. Proclaim to them a God who death couldn't hold. Tell them of a love that is larger than life and a promise that no power can prevent! This Easter may we no longer be reluctant witnesses who struggle with an Easter silence, but instead, by the power of the Spirit, speak boldly and powerfully about our Savior who keeps His Word! For Christ is Risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

Mama and Yinette are still doing well after papa's passing. Mama has a lot of neighbors and friends. They have visitors quite often. And of course most of them need a meal and Yinette always takes care of them. Some of mama's friends will stay the night. But one of the neatest things that mama has started is having "church" at their house. They will gather with a cup of coffee (I make sure mama gets coffee every week in the groceries). And they watch Mt. Calvary on their TV with their neighbors and friends. As strange as this whole virtual mission has been - it's even more amazing that through the things that we have done there are others sharing and hearing about Christ. I know there are positive and negative aspects to "online" church - but whoever dreamed this would happen? On top of that they don't speak English. But they are still blessed and mama is blessed to share it.

[I'm repeating this paragraph from last month] We think of mission work as something that goes on somewhere else. With people not very much like us. In faraway places. I know I don't think I ever "humanized" it so much before. I empathized with the families (if they were from the US). I could imagine being somewhere that was not home and missing all the things we grow to expect. But I don't think I ever thought much about the people being missioned to. That's what's so incredible about The Least of These. They are real people. With pains and joys, happiness and sadness. They have a heritage and traditions - just like we do. God works in remarkable ways.

Mortgage Reduction Opportunity (MRO) - Update

Mt. Calvary kicked off the MRO program in January of 2023. After a full year of support from our members and some non-members, I am happy to report we are making significant progress toward reducing our mortgage principal, thus reducing interest costs, and advancing the final payoff date. Below are the details:

- Our monthly mortgage payments are \$5,211.50 per month at an interest rate of 4.5%.
- 2) Our mortgage balance at the start of the MRO (Jan. 1, 2023) was \$437,366 with 101 months to payoff. Our mortgage balance as of the Feb. 2, 2024 payment, is expected to be \$253,335, with 54 months to payoff. This is due to an additional \$134,197 in principal from the MRO being paid.
- 3) In summary we have saved over \$51,094 in future interest and advanced the payoff date by almost 4 years so far
- 4) The March MRO contribution will be at least \$13,126 as of now, but still growing!

The sources of this additional funding have come from numerous sources, not just member contributions. For example, just this month alone the recent Chili Supper, Sale of Baked Goods, Silent Auction and Food Fundraiser brought in \$5,352. This is a group effort and paying dividends for the future! I would like to thank everyone for their support on this program and the end is in sight.

Just a reminder if you're a Thrivent member, you can designate your Thrivent Choice dollars to Mt Calvary, but you need to designate those periodically, so check your account. Also note the opportunity to use electronic giving at <u>https://www.mtcalvarydecatur.org/giving</u>. This method allows giving to Weekly/General Fund, Building Fund, Mortgage Reduction, Elder's, Venezuela Mission, and Other giving.
