

## A Message from Pastor Hinrichs

"Do not be deceived, my beloved brothers. Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change. Of his own will he brought us forth by the word of truth, that we should be a kind of firstfruits of -James 1:16-18 (ESV)

It finally feels like Spring is here! The weather is attempting to warm up (minus the overnight cold snaps here and there), trees and shrubs are beginning to bud, gardens are starting to grow, and excitement over new adventures is on the horizon as the school years ends and many kids are graduating. It seems that even our normal routines and responsibilities start to shift as summer draws near. Spring is certainly a season of change!

While many of these adjustments are welcome, there are plenty of changes in our life that we aren't as excited about. When an injury takes us from our home to a skilled care facility. When a loved one passes. When friends move away. Honestly, it could even be something as simple as when your favorite restaurant changes their menu! Whatever the circumstance may be, big or little, significant or superficial, change is all around us.

It is in the midst of this changing world that God's Word comes to give certainty and stability. In the book of James we hear this promise, "Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change." With these words, James is telling us that in a world where everything is constantly changing and so much seems up in the air, we do well to remember that God is still in charge. He never changes. His promise to give good and perfect gifts to His children is just as certain today as it was yesterday and the day before.

In college, we had a tradition of attending a brief prayer service on Thursday evenings. The service, called Compline, is in our new hymnal and is a beautiful service to prepare our hearts and souls for the night's rest. This time of worship became something we could count on, something we knew would always be there. It was this service of Compline which reminded us of the stability we have in Christ, our God whose love and care does not change. One of the prayers we would pray in that service has stuck with me in the years that followed. To this day, I will still pray it when dealing with change and uncertainty. The prayer goes like this: "Be present, merciful God, and protect us through the hours of this night, so that we who are wearied by the changes and chances of life may find rest in You; through Jesus Christ, our Lord." This simple, yet beautiful prayer reminds us that in the changes and chances of this life, God gives rest to our souls who are worn out by dealing with uncertainty. Our God is a God whose love never changes and whom we can always count on no matter what.

So, my brothers and sisters, take heart. Even though change and uncertainty may come, God still gives His good and perfect gifts to us, with the same love and care He has always shown. Look always to the Cross of Christ, and know that you have a foundation that is sure and stable. No uncertainty, no change or chance of life, can ever change God's love for you!

## Venezuelan News: Volume 3-05

May 2024

I would like to start out by thanking all of the Mt. Calvary family who give to this mission. There are many of you and you all deserve thanks and God's blessings. So many of you give me emotional support as well. There are times this exercise can be very daunting. When you run out of money before you can feed them all is very disheartening. We've recently had a few bad weeks. It's been down to the wire every week on who would eat and who wouldn't. I need to develop more sources and I've just not discovered any new ones. I've tried Synod, district and LHM. I have never even gotten an answer. Nothing.

We have had a good thing happen this last month. Sonja and her daughter Camillia were in a very bad neighborhood. She basically lived in a tin shack. There was no insulation or ceiling so the sun boring down on the tin really made it hot. And they only had fans - no air conditioning. Daily temperatures are in the high 30's to low 40's Celsius (35c = 95f 43c = 109f). It is very humid. Adding to the heat as well. And remember you can't take a cold shower or bath - you have to conserve your water as best you can. But there is good here - Sonja has moved in with Miranda. Miranda lives in a much nicer house in a much nicer area. It's good knowing that both Miranda and Sonja will be safer now. And they can share food and supplies. Sonja still needs an air conditioner but she is in such a better place. As we say in Spanish - poco a poco (little by little).

The power conditions in Venezuela have not and probably will not improve. There is a power outage every day, sometimes two or three times a day. Yili had her power come back - and then it cycled up and down 6 times. It ruined a couple of surge strips but worse - all the lights that were on in the house. And now the government is charging the citizens for the power usage (so much for socialism). But when the power is on and it's a Sunday morning, mama has one or more of her friends watching church with her and Yinette (on Facebook). If the power is off, they watch it later.

As for conditions in Venezuela I would ask you to continue praying. There is also a great deal of turmoil over the upcoming elections. President Maduro has "disqualified" all the opposing candidates. One thing that Maduro has threatened the citizens with is shutting off all social media. Facebook is very important in our ability to communicate with our friends and provide them a worship service.

Just a reminder, if you are an online giver, you can now designate funds to be given to The Least of These and the church treasurer and financial secretary will make sure your donations get there. You can also give at church, just designate that it is for the Least of These. I would ask you to continue to pray for this ministry and its future. I am looking for ways to source sponsors that can give regularly. I am open to advice or help. Pray for our friends in Venezuela. ## Seasons of Discovery: Post-Vision Day Update!

We want to say a BIG THANK YOU to all of those who attended our Vision Day workshop on Saturday, April 20<sup>th</sup>. It was a very thought-provoking experience that helped us learn how to use the tools and techniques we've been practicing as we seek God's guidance for future ministry and service to our community. While we are moving closer to a clear vision statement we can all rally around, there are still a few more steps to take. At this time, our goal is to formally present about the efforts at our next Voter's Meeting on June 2<sup>nd</sup>. In between now and then here are a few of the steps we will be taking.

- Next week (April 29-May 3) we will have a debrief meeting with those who attended the Visioning Day to talk through some of the discussion points and to answer any lingering questions and concerns.
- After that, we will have a couple smaller teams that will meet to:
  - Help solidify our "ministry targets" and begin drafting possible "Vision Statements"
  - Coordinate with the Church Council in their short-term and long-term planning and budgeting work.
- Present the material to the Church Council for review prior to the June Voter's meeting.

If you would like to be part of this process, please talk to Pastor Brett or one of our Elders. Even if you are not interested, please pray that God would continue to guide this process and give wisdom to our leaders in this time of planning and preparation. In the end, we know this is Jesus' ministry and all we seek to do is to join Him in the work He's already doing!
